


To this union, Connie and Brett were born. Russ passed away on February 22, 1985. Following Russ's death, Arlie was busy raising her family. On August 16, 1992, she, and A. R. Sellevold were married in Slayton. A. R. passed away on August 11, 2011. In 2019, Arlie moved to Sunrise Terrace in Slayton. In September 2022, she moved to Lindenwood Assisted Living in Slayton. Arlie passed away on August 6, 2023, at the Murray County Medical Center in Slayton at the age of 94. If you did not listen, you would find yourself tiptoeing across the room because she lifted you by your ear. Her worldly advice was: "Stay busy enough so you don't have time to be in the pool hall" and "Keep all four wheels on the pavement."
